The Council meetings are held at 7.30pm on the first Tuesday of the month.

Who can be a Parish Councillor? You must

- be a UK or commonwealth citizen,
- be a least 18 years old.
- be on the electoral register of the parish, or;
- during the previous 12 months have worked in the parish
- or, for the whole of the previous 12 months lived in the parish or within three miles of the parish boundary.

Major Planning Applications in/near West Hill

Major outline planning applications have been submitted for sites in West Hill:

- **22/2533/MOUT** Land to the north of Oak Road: for the erection of 23no. dwellings with all matters reserved save for formation of vehicular and pedestrian access.
- 23/0727/MOUT Land to the North of Eastfield: for the erection of up to 30 dwellings with all matters
 reserved apart from means of access



- Strongvox has recently carried out a public consultation on a proposed development of 36 homes on land at Windmill Lane. It's anticipated that they will soon submit a planning application to EDDC.
- An amended major application, **21/1688/MFUL**, is currently under consideration for a roadside service area at Daisymount junction.
