- **Stay at Home!** Everyone can play their part in this situation. Staying at home is the most important thing many of us can do.
- Can your **house name or number** be easily found/read from the road? Please take a few minutes to check as this will help our lovely volunteers and the emergency services find you!
- Please avoid having any bonfires whilst the Coronavirus controls are in place and to store garden waste rather than burning it.
- We know many of youare taking the opportunity to do your **spring cleaning**. As all the Council household waste and recycling centres, the charity shops and the Salvation army bin in McColls car park are currently closed, please keep your bags at home.
- If you're walking on the footpaths and lanes please remember the Countryside Code. **Respect** other people leave gates and property as you find them and follow paths unless wider access is available. **Protect** the natural environment: leave no trace of your visit and take your litter home. Keep dogs under effective control. **Enjoy** the outdoors.

As the ward member for West Hill and Aylesbeare, I am working closely with the District Council in order to provide the support that everyone needs at this very difficult time.

We have a brilliant community spirit with our residents helping each other. I am very grateful for all the key workers who live in our community and who are doing so much for public health and safety.

The District Council has set up a **community hub** https://eastdevon.gov.uk/coronavirus-covid-19/ (Tel 01395 571500 Mon-Fri 9am-5pm). The purpose of the hub is to work alongside the many groups across the District who are providing local information and support, in order that none of our residents feel alone or unsupported in this crisis. If you are aware of any **vulnerable residents** who you believe may not be getting the help that they need, please contact me, the Parish Council or the community hub.

Many people have experienced a **change in financial circumstance**. If you need any financial assistance particularly with regards council tax or rent please do contact the District Council either by telephone on 01404 515616 or https://eastdevon.gov.uk/coronavirus-covid-19/

The District Council is liaising closely with the network of **food banks** in the District. Should you need to access these for any reason the District Council can act as a referrer. Please contact our Community Hub or please feel free to contact me (see below)

One of the services offered by the District Council which may be helpful at this time to some older or vulnerable residents is its 24/7 **telecare alarm service**, Home Safeguard. The cost is around £5 per week. For further information please contact the District Council on 01395 578237 or email homesafeguard@eastdevon.gov.uk.

In relation to **waste and recycling** the green waste and bulky waste collections are currently suspended. EDDC are reminding residents to please wash their hands after handling recycling and waste containers to and from the kerbside.
